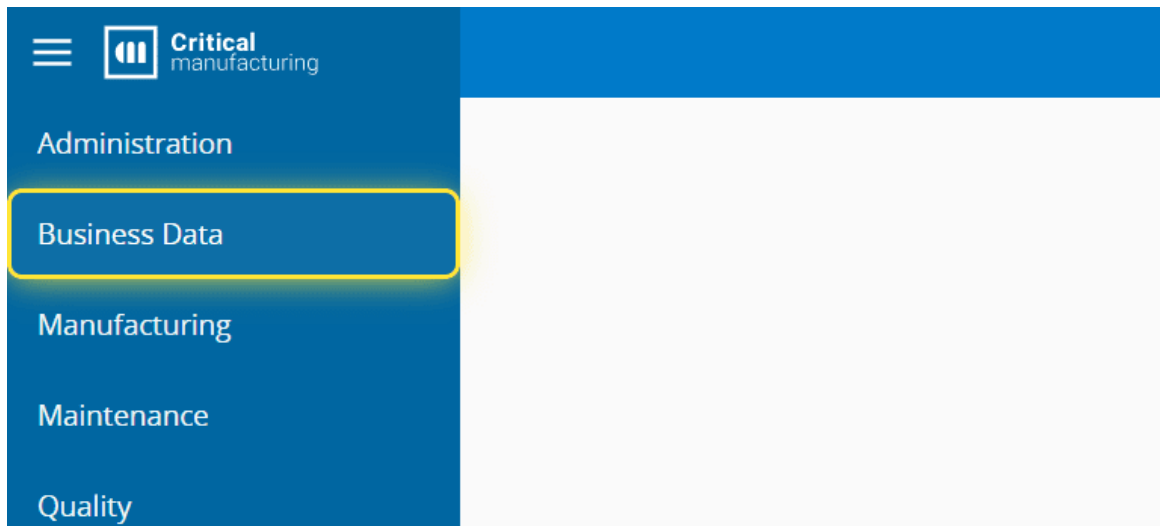

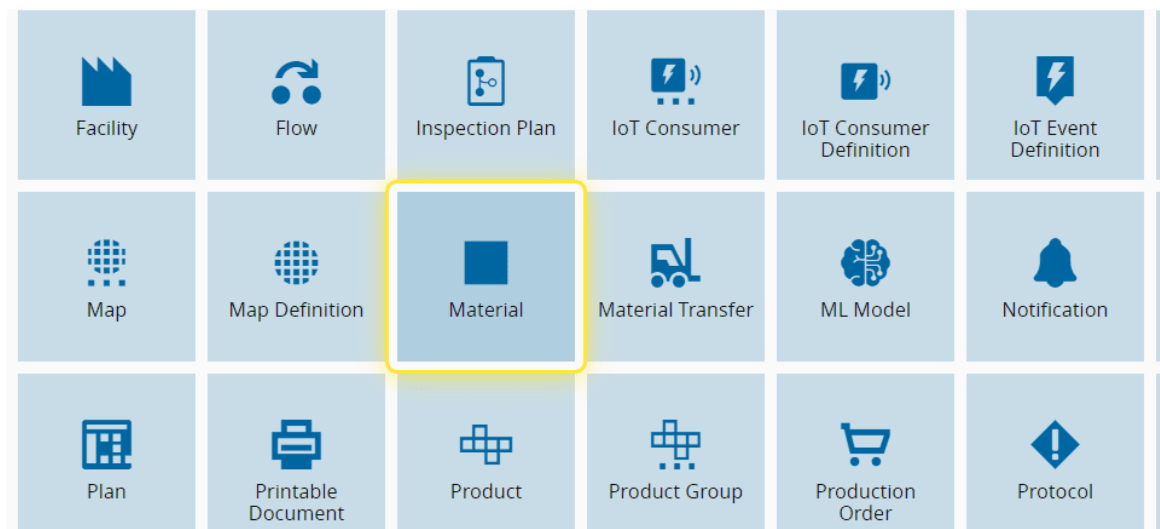

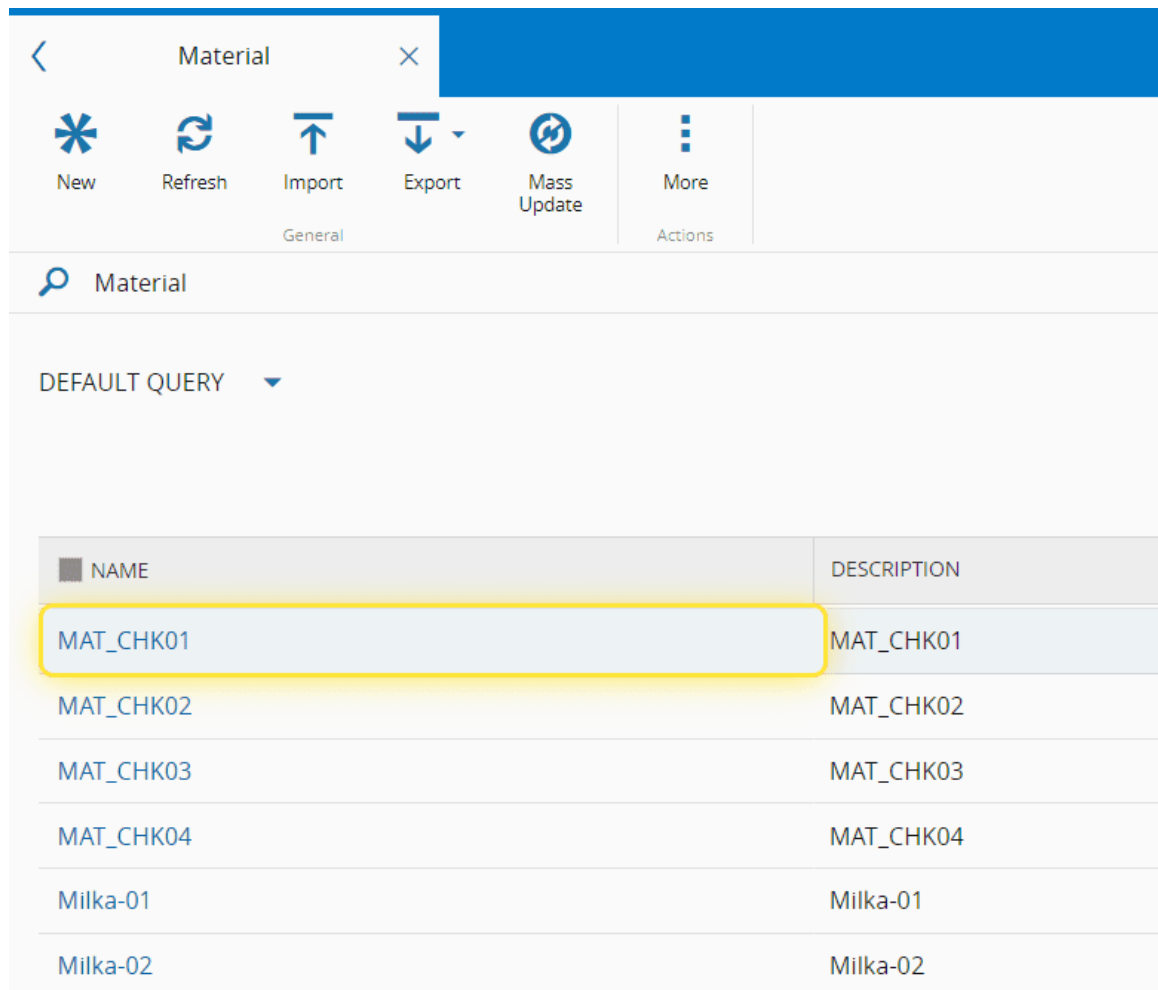
1. Go to the Business Data menu.

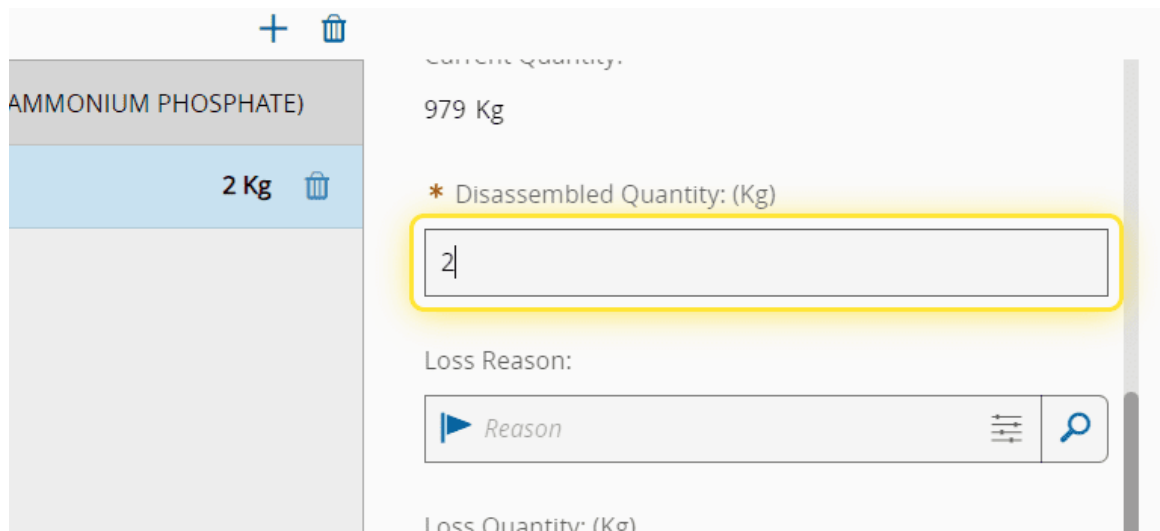

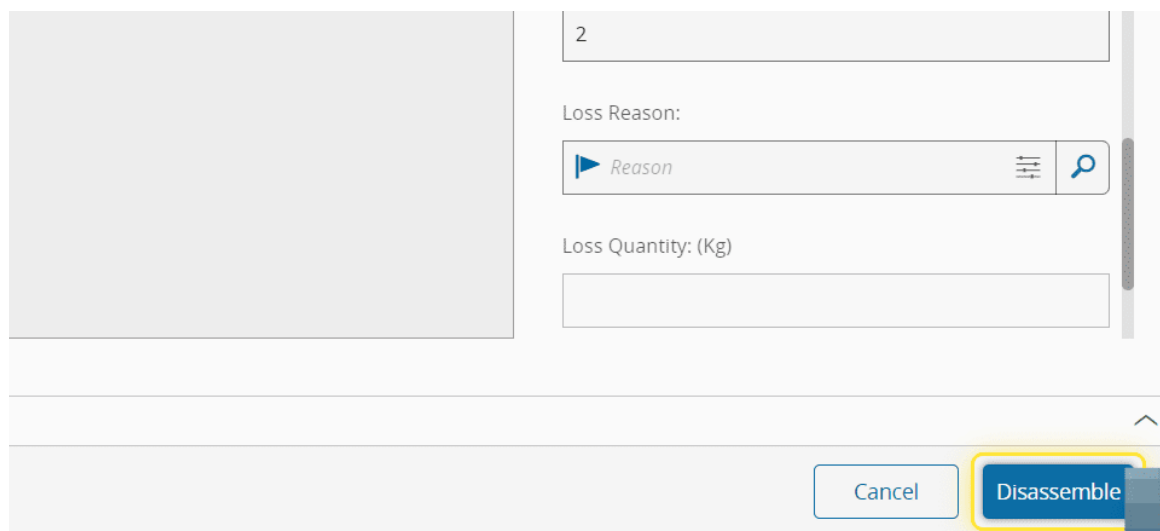
